Please remember that Union Square is a CHAP district and a National Register Historic District. Any work done on your property needs to respect the historic materials and original style of construction. Vinyl replacement windows are not allowed

on the facades of houses in our neighborhood. Paint colors need a CHAP approval permit. The permit is free of charge, but it must be obtained and posted or you can be subject to a fine. Call CHAP at 410-396-4866 for information.

We will not hold an association meeting in July, instead we will have a picnic in August. Watch your mailbox for a flyer! Our September meeting will have a presentation about getting CHAP and State Tax Credits for a large range of house renovation projects. You can even get them for projects you have already completed, as long as you have before pictures! So snap those photos
