  - VITAL SIGNS 3 – Now Available!**  
Now you can see the progress Baltimore has made from 2000-2003! Vital Signs 3 is the 3rd in the annual series of reports on the Vital Signs – outcome indicators that “take the pulse” of Baltimore neighborhoods, measuring progress toward strong neighborhoods, good quality of life, and a thriving city over time. There are 40 Vital Signs organized into seven topic areas ranging from housing, sanitation, and safety to workforce, health, environment, and child well-being. You have seen some of these Vital Signs featured in the Baltimore Sun every Monday.  
Now you can see the impact your actions have on improving Baltimore, and continue to move these Vital Signs in the right direction! Here are some highlights!
    - Mortgage foreclosures are down 21 percent since 2001
    - Over 15 percent more students scored in the highest range in the 3rd grade reading scores
    - Violent Crime decreased 24.3 percent between 2000 and the end of 2003
    - Teen birth rate decreased by 18.2 percent
    - Rate of people with vaccine preventable diseases (like Hepatitis A and B, flu, etc) decreased by almost 37 percent
    - Nearly 28 percent of the population ages 16 and over who are employed use another mode of transportation other than a car to get to work (including public transit, walking, etc)
    - Median days on the market fell 46 percent since 2000, from 52 days to 28 days – homes are selling faster than ever.
