The Red Line Station Area Advisory Committee (SAAC) is an 18 month process intended to bring community involvement to the design of local stations. The SAAC is an advisory committee to the engineers of the red line station and our role as the Harlem Park SAAC, is to be the bridge between the community and the designers. Our first exercise is to map the community for them. Basically point out the significant features (Schools, Parks, Key Buildings) and traffic patterns so they will better understand the flow of our neighborhood.
